Then the Selectmen made a report concerning the easway near Mr John Haynes and said report was accepted which is as follows (viz) Sudbury September 13<sup>th</sup> 1824. We the Subscribers a Committee chosen at May Meeting 1824. according to an article in the warrant of said Meeting to view the easway near Mr John Haynes and see what repairs are necessary to be made on said easway have attended to that service and beg leave to report as follows.

That provided small stone can be procured it would be best to lay such a quantity of small stones on the lower side of the easway as to prevent the gravel from washing off and that it is necessary to take up the middle sluiceway and make it much larger which will have tendency to carry off a greater proportion of the water which now runs over the easway.

6<sup>th</sup> Article. Voted to raise a committee to consist of five persons for the purpose of viewing the stove in the Centre School house and procuring such repairs as they shall think necessary and the gentleman were appointed for that purpose.

7<sup>th</sup> Article. Voted that the Highway Surveyor for 1825. be directed to lay the sluiceway across the road near Mr Daniel Puffer &c to be allowed as Highway work the stones to be found by Col. Rice to be allowed his Highway tax for said year.

8<sup>th</sup> Article. passed over not acted upon.

9<sup>th</sup> Article. Voted to appropriate money out of the unappropriated money now in the Treasurer or may be in the Treasury sufficient to pay the execution that the Town of Concord holds against the Town of Sudbury and also the Bill said Concord holds against said Sudbury.

Then the Town Voted to dissolve this Meeting
