Middlesex Co. To Mr. Samuel Knight Constable of Sudbury
in said County — — — Greeting

You are hereby required in the Name of the Commonwealth
of Massachusetts to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the
town of Sudbury qualified to vote for Representatives to the
general court of this Commonwealth, to Assemble at the
Meeting house in said town on the 1st day of November
next at 1. O'clock in the after noon then and there to bring
in their votes to the Selectmen for fifteen Electors of
President and Vice President of the United States qualified
according to the constitution thereof — Agreeable to a resolve
of the general court passed June the 8th A.D. 1824.

And you are also in like manner required to notify and warn
all the Inhabitants of said town to Assemble at the said Meeting
house in said town on Monday the 1st day of November aforesaid
at 2. O'clock in the after noon to bring in their votes to the
Selectmen for a Representative of the People of said Common-
wealth in the Congress of the United States for the Middlesex
District.

None of you are not to fail of Making return of this
warrant to some one of the Selectmen previous to the opening
of said Meeting And also with your doings there on — — —
