At a legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury on Mon. day
the 2^d day of May A.D. 1825 proceeded upon the business
of said day by taking up the 1st Article and made
choir of William Hunt Esq^r for Moderator.

2^d Article put over for the present.

3^d Article granted to the Rev^d Rufus Hurlbut in
addition to the interest on the Ministerial fund the
sum of - - - - - \$ 457.95

4th granted for the support of the Grammar School 375.00
also for wood for said Schools the sum of 30.00
to be equally divided in the five districts - -

5th granted for the reading and writing schools 150.00
to be equally divided in the five schools districts.

6th Article granted for the support of the Poor and
paying out standing orders & accounts for Poor 1200-

7th Article granted the sum of 10 Dollars to pay the
Treasurer and 20 Dollars to pay the Assessors } 30-00

8th Article Voted to leave it with the Selectmen as
as was expressed in said Article -

9th Article the Town Voted to choose two agents to appose
said road as expressed in said Article and the following
gentleman were chosen (viz) Asper Goodnow Esq, and
Capt Enock Kidder for the purpose above expressed.

10th Article Voted to give liberty to Oliver Hayes to pasture
brimston Lane the year ensuing -

11th Article Voted to Grant the sum of Sixty Dollars for the
Support of a Singing School and appoint a committee of three
persons to lay out the same and appointed the same committee
that was appointed the last year (viz) Asper Goodnow Esq,
Capt William Brigham Enock Kidder Then the Town
reconsidered the vote of the grant of Sixty Dollars and granted
the sum of - - - - - \$ 45.
in addition to the thirty Dollars that was granted the last
year and voted to add two on to the committee and
the the following gentleman were chosen (viz) Mr
Benjamin Richardson and Capt Samuel Jones, to see to the
laying out the above said money to the best advantage to the
Town.
