8th Article put over to April Meeting for further consideration

10th Article, Voted to allow Capt Wm Rice Interest on the money from the 1st day of April 1825 to the 1st of March 1826. then the town reconsidered the vote of allowing Capt Wm Rice Interest then voted to pass over the article and not act upon it any further - - - - -

12th Article, Voted to pass over this article and not act upon it. -

13th Article put over to April Meeting for further consideration

Then the Town by their vote dissolved the Meeting

March 17th then John Hunt Samuel Knight and Henry Fairbanks took the oath of the office to preside at the elections during the year as Selectmen

Middlesex Co. To Mr. Samuel Knight Constable of the Town of Sudbury in the County of said County - - - - - greeting

you are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn all the freeholders of said town qualified by Law as is provided in the constitution of this Commonwealth to vote in the choice of Gov^r Lieut^r Governor and Senators for the year ensuing to assemble at the Meeting House in said town on Monday the 3^d day of April next at 1 o'clock in the afternoon on said day then and there to give in their votes for the choice of Gov^r Lieut^r Gov^r and Senators of said Commonwealth and Senators for the Middlesex district for the year ensuing

Hence if you are not to fail of making your return of this warrant with your doings there on to some one of the Selectmen previous to the opening of said meeting
