day then and there to act on the following Articles viz

- 1st To chuse a Moderator
- 2^d To bring in their Votes for Some Suitable Person for
a County Treasurer for the year ensuing
- 3^d To fill Vacancies in those Town officers that appear to
be Vacant
- 4th To act upon the 5th 8th and 13th articles of the Warrant
of March Meeting and referred to April Meeting for
further consideration
- 5th To see if the Town will except of the Settlement of the
Selectmen with the Town Treasurer and order the
same to be recorded
- 6th To see attend to the reports of Committees if any are made
- 7th To see if the Town will take any Measures for the purpose
of rebuilding the small Bridge on the long easeway to
do or act as the town shall think best
- 8th To see if the Town give Capt William Rice Interest on the
money granted him for a road taken through his land
- 9th To see if the Town will direct the Selectmen to open a road
as laid out by the Selectmen of the town of Sudbury
