12th To See if Town will open a road for the accomodation of William Hurd or abate his Highway Taxes in futer to do, or act, as the Town shall think best.

Hereof you are not to fail and make ~~an~~ returne of this Warrant with your doings there on to some one of the Selectmen previous to the opening of said Meeting

Pursuant to the within Warrant I have Summon and notified the inhabitant of said town qualified as therein expressed to assemble at time and place and for the purpos mentioned

Samuel Knight Constable

At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury on Monday the 3^d day of April AD 1826 - proceeded upon the 1st business of said day ^{by taking up the 1st Article} and made choise of Aspher Goodnow Esq. for Moderator of said Meeting -

2nd Article brote in their Votes for a County Treasurer as followers and on counting said Votes it appeared that the Hon. John Keyes had forty one Votes

3rd then brote in their Votes for a Town Treasurer and made choise of Aspher Goodnow Esq. Treasurer, and was qualified for said office by the Town Clerk.

Then the town voted to pass over the remainder of this 3^d Article article for the present, and took up the 4th Article which contains the 5th Article of the warrant of March Meeting and it was moved and seconded that the same Measures ^{153.1} in regard to the collecting the Taxes as was adopted the last year and it passed in the affirmative. Then Mr. Martin Brown, come forward and offered to take the collecting of the Taxes for one per cent on the Polls if he was chosen Constable
