Pursuant to the within Warrant I have Summoned and notified the Inhabitants of said town qualified as there in expressed to assemble at time and place and for the purposes within mentioned

At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury on Monday the 6th day of November A.D. 1826. proceeded upon the business of said day by taking up the 1st article and made choice of Asaph Goodnow Esq for Moderator

2^d Article the Town voted to choose agents and appointed the Selectmen of said town for their agents to attend upon the Commissioners on the two petitions as expressed in said Article to act in behalf of said town what they should think would be for the best interest.

3^d Article voted to pass over this article not to act upon it

4th Article voted not to except of the Bridle way as laid out by the Selectmen through the land of Joel Jones -

5th Article voted to put over this article to March meeting for further consideration

6th Article voted to appoint the Selectmen a Committee to make the repairs on the two Bridges as expressed in said Article.

7th Article chose Mr. Joel Moore for pound keeper and was qualified by taking the oath of office

8th Article the Town voted that the Selectmen be directed to prosecute either the Town of Wintertown or Heathtown for the support of the late Thomas Whitcomb family as they should see fit of the report of their Committee who were chosen in April last

9th Article voted to except of the report of the tomb Committee and ordered the same to be recorded

Your Committee who were chosen in April last to locate land on the Meeting plat where on tombs may be erected and also to confer with the Petitioners on some uniform plan by which said tombs might be built have attended that Service and ask leave to report. (V's)

That they have placed a Stake and Stones about eight feet north of the west post in the fence west of the Horse House thence running Southwesterly to a Stake and Stone still running Southwesterly.
