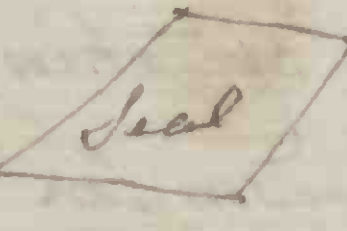


March Anno Domini 1827.

Middlesex Co. To Mr. Martin Brown Constable of the
Town of Sudbury in said County — Greeting

 You are hereby required in the Name of the common
wealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn all the ^{male} inhabitants
of said town of Sudbury qualified by law to vote in the choice of
Town officers and town officers to meet at the Meeting house in
said town on Monday the 5th day of March next at 12 O'clock
at noon on said day then and there to act on the following
Articles (viz)

- 1st To choose a Moderator, Town Clerk, ^{selectmen,} ~~Town Treasurer,~~
Town Treasurer, Assessors, Constable, School Committee
and all other Town officers to be chosen in the month of
March or April Annually
- 2^d To see if the Town will repair their Highways by a rate
the present year and grant a suitable sum of money for
repairing the same
- 3^d To see if the Town will give liberty for Swine, Horses, mules,
neats cattle, and Sheep, to go at large the present year.
- 4th To see if the Town will take the same measures for the purpose
of collecting their Taxes that may be Assessed upon the inhabitants
of said Town as was adopted the year past and to agree with
some suitable person or persons to collect the same for the year
ensuing to do or act as the town shall think best when met
- 5th To see if the Town accept of the report of the trustees of the
Sudbury Ministerial fund Corporation the state of the fund
and the interest arising thereon. And all other reports of
committees that may be offered. — — —
- 6th To see if the Town choose a committee to settle all accounts
that may be brought in against said town.
- 7th To see if the Town will discontinue Mr. Loring's
highway Tax in future.
- 8th To see if the Town give liberty that the several School
houses in said town to be occupied for religious meeting
during the time of schooling or at any other time —
- 9th To see if the town will take any measures for the purpose
of making such payers to the Meeting house in said town
as shall be deemed proper to be made to do, or, act way on this
article as the town shall think best when met.
