At a legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury in the County of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts in Town Meeting Assembled Qualified by the Constitution to vote in the choice of Governor Licut. Governor of said Commonwealth and Senators and Counsellors for the Middlesex district. holden on Monday the 2^d day of April AD 1827. Then the Inhabitants proceeded and brot in thier votes. The whole number votes given in ware sorted, counted recorded, and declaration thereof made, as by the Constitution is directed - and ware for the following persons -
