you are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of
Massachusetts to notify and warn all the freeholders and other
Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified as the Law directs
to vote in the choice of Representatives and all others qualified
to vote in the choice of Town Officers to meet at the Meetinghouse
in said town on Monday the 2^d day of April next at three
O'clock in the afternoon on said day then and there to act
on the following Articles (viz)

- 1st To choose a Moderator.
- 2^d To bring in their votes for some suitable person for a County
Treasurer for the year ensuing
- 3^d To fill all Vacancies in Town Officers that appear to be vacant
- 4th To except of the Settlement of the Selectmen with the town Treasurer
- 5th To see if the Town will act on 5th Article of the last December
meeting and referred to March Meeting for further consideration
- 6th To attend to all reports of Committees if any are offered.
- 7th To see if the Town will discount certain Taxes which shall be
brought forward by the collector.
- 8th To see if Town make any alteration in the mode of collecting
Taxes to do or act any way on this article as the town shall think
best when meet. ---
