You are hereby required in the Name of the Common-  
-wealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn the Inhab-  
-itants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town  
appears to meet at the meeting house in said Sudbury  
on Monday the 15<sup>th</sup> day of September next at two  
o'clock in the afternoon on said day then and there  
to act on the following Articles (viz)

1 To choose a Moderator

2<sup>d</sup> To grant a Sum of money to enable their Committee  
to defray the expence of repairing the meeting-house to do  
or act any way on this article as the town shall think best  
when meet it being agreeable to a Petition of Tilley Haynes  
and others -

3<sup>d</sup> To see if the town will take any measures to exchange  
the old Bell for a new one to do, or act, any way on  
this Article as the town shall think best when meet  
it being agreeable to said Petition of Tilley Haynes & others

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting an  
Attested copy thereof at the Public meeting house in said  
town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding  
said meeting -

Hereof fail not and make due returne of this  
warrant with your doings thereon to our selves at the  
time and place of meeting aforesaid
