you are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote for a Representative to the General Court of this Commonwealth to Assemble at the meeting-house in said town on Monday the third day of November next it being the first Monday of said month at 1 O'clock in the afternoon on said day then and there to bring in their votes to the Selectmen for fifteen Electors of President and Vice President of the United States qualified according to the Constitution thereof agreeable to an act of the General Court passed June the 10th AD 1828 -

And you also in like manner required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of said town to Assemble at the meeting-house in said town on Monday the 3^d day of November next at 2 O'clock in the afternoon on said day to bring in their votes to the Selectmen for a Representative of the People of the ~~United States~~ said Commonwealth in the Congress of the United States for ^{the} Middlesex District -

And you are directed to serve this warrant by Posting up attested copy ^{thereof} at the Public meeting-house in said town two sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting -
