Sudbury Nov. 10th 1828

The town being met to the the foregoing adjournment and proceeded upon the unfinished business of said warrant and took up the 4th Article and voted put over said Article to March meeting -

5th Article it was moved and seconded that the Selectmen be directed to lay out said road and make the best bargain they can with the parties and report to the town at some future meeting -

6th Article The town voted to Authorise Asher Goodnow Esq. to give deeds of the new Pews that are to be sold in the meeting-house

7th Article, Voted to reserve two Pews at the north end of ^{the} east gallery in the meeting-house ^{two town paupers} then voted to reserve two Pews at the north end of the west gallery for free seats. Then voted to reserve the four new Pews on the west side of the Pulpit for free seats -

8th Article, Voted to pass over this Article and not to act upon it

9th Article, Voted not to act upon this Article

Then voted to discontinue this meeting

Middlesex ss. To Christphor G Luthor Constable of the Town of
Sudbury in said County Greeting

You are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in the choice of town officers and town officers to meeting-house in said town at 12 O. Clock at noon on said day then and there to act on the following Articles (viz)

1st To Choose a Moderator, Town Clarke, Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Assessors, Constable, School Committee, and all other Town officers that are by Law required to be chosen in the month of March or April -

2^d To grant a suitable Sum of money for the support of the several Schools in said town in compliance with the late law on that Subject -

3^d To see if the town will repair their Highways by a rate the present year and Grant a suitable Sum of money for repairing the same
