You are hereby required in the Name of the Commonwealth
of Massachusetts to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the
Town of Sudbury qualified to Vote in Elections to meet at the
Meeting-house in Sudbury on Monday the sixth day of April
at one O'clock in the afternoon being the first Monday of said
month.

To bring in their Votes to the Selectmen for Governor and
Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth and for five Senators
on one ballot for the Middlesex district for the year ensuing.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting
up attested copy thereof at the Public meeting-house in said
Town two Sabbath at least before the time of holding said
meeting.

Hence of fail not and make due returne of this warrant
with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place
of holding said meeting.
