11th To see if the town will sell any more Pews in the meeting-house - By request of Mr Luther Goodnow

12th To see if the town will appropriate the surplus of the last years Taxes to be applied for the expence of repairing the Meetinghouse

13th To see if the town will order the town Incasurer to give Bonds to the town for their faithfull performance of his office

14th To see if the town will direct their Appraisors to take the Invoice of the taxable property of the Inhabitance of said town the present year - And put every Person under oath that they surshet that do not give in correctly -

And you are hereby directed to serve this warrant by posting up attested copies of it at the Public Meeting house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting

Hence of Fail not and make returne of this warrant with your doings, thare on to our selves at the time and place of holding said meeting
