In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby
required to notify and warn all the male Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury
qualified by the Constitution and Laws of this Commonwealth to vote in the
choir of a Representative to meet at the Meeting house in said town on mon-
day the 4th day of May next at one o'clock in the afternoon on said day
to choose a Representative to represent them in the General Court to be
convened and holden at Boston on the last Wednesday of May.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by Posting up attested
copy thereof at the Public meeting house ^{in said town} two Sabbaths at least before
the time set for holding said meeting

Hereof fail not and make returne of this warrant with
your doings there on to our selves at the time and place of hold-
ing said meeting.

Sudbury May the 4th 1829
Pursuant to the within Warrant I have notified ^{and warned} all the male
Inhabitants of said town to appear at time and place and for the
purposes within mentioned Christopher G Lutton, Constable
of Sudbury

At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury on Monday the 4th
day of May AD 1829 Proceeded upon the business of said
day by Bringing in their votes for a Representative to represent
them in the General Court of this Commonwealth and Abel
Whelan being a Freeholder and resident in said town was made
chair of to serve & represent said town in the General Court for the year
ensuing having the number of fifty nine votes

John Hunt had one vote Ed Fairbank had one vote

Then the town by their vote dissolved this meeting
