Pursuant to the above warrant I have notified and warned the male inhabitants of said town qualified as therein expressed to meet at time and place and for the several purposes therein expressed

- At a legal town meeting held in Sudbury Nov. 16th 1829
- Proceeded upon the business of said day by taking up the
- 1st Article, and made choice of Capt. William Brigham Moderator
- 2^d Article the town by their vote voted to choose three agents to oppose the petition of Sullivan Thayer and others to be chosen by nomination and the following persons were chosen (viz) Abel Wheeler, William Brigham, John Hunt, and said agents were instructed to use their best influence to oppose the proposed road, but if laid out to get as much of the expense on the county as possible. Then took up the 3^d Article then the town voted to pass over this 3^d article for the present and took up the 2^d Article again and voted that two be added to the number of agents to oppose the laying out said road with the same instructions And Mr. Levi Smith and Mr. John Brown were chosen for that purpose
- 3^d Article. Then voted to appoint the same agents to act on the petition of Christopher Gutter and others and to act discretionary on said petition
- 4th Article. Voted that the selectmen be directed to lay claims to the piece of land as expressed in said Article in such a way that the town may have it in their possession immediately
- 5th Article. Voted that the Town Treasurer be directed to use his best judgement to collect said promissory notes to see for them if he thinks proper as soon as they may be met to put good money to bed
