To bring in their votes to the Selectmen for Governor and Lieut. Governor of the Commonwealth and for five Senators on one ballot for the Middlesex District for the year ensuing

And you are hereby directed to serve this Warrant by Posting up ~~this~~ Attested copy of this warrant at the public meeting house in said town two Sabbath after at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due returne of this warrant with your doings there on to our selves at the time and place of holding said meeting.
