Middlesex ss Levi Smith Constable of the Town of Sudbury
in said County Greeting

you are hereby required in the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to notify and warn all the male Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified by the Constitution to vote in the Chair of a Representative to meet at the Meeting house in said Sudbury on Monday the third day of May next at 10 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of choosing a Representative to represent them in the General Court appointed to be convened and held at Boston on the ~~first~~ day of May next

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up attested copy thereof at public Meeting house in said town two sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting

~~And if fail not~~ and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to our selves at time and place of holding said meeting

Given under our hands and seal at Sudbury this twentieth day of April AD 1830.

At a legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury May 3^d 1830 proceeded upon the business of said day and voted in their votes for a Representative and after counting and sorting the votes it appeared that Abel Wheeler was chosen having the number of thirty six votes and Levi W. Brigham had the number eight votes
