At a legal town meeting held in Sudbury on Monday the 7th day of March A.D. 1831 the town took up the 1st Article in the Warrant and made choice of Enos Thiele as Moderator, Nahum Thompson was chosen Clerk and qualified in open town meeting - Then the town voted to have three selectmen and choose for
