

Brought over March meeting March Anno Domini 1831

4th Article - Voted to dispose of the poor in the same manner as last year - Then voted to reconsider the last vote

Then voted to choose a committee to enquire and see how a farm can be purchased for a Poor Establishment and to report at a future meeting - Then voted to choose a committee of five one in each school District and choose William Rice, John Hunt, Charles Garry, Adam Howe, & Enoch Kidder
Then voted to dispose of the poor in the same manner as last year

5th Article - Put over to April meeting

6th Article - Voted to choose a committee of three to examine and allow the amounts brought against the town

Then voted to reconsider the last vote - Then voted to put over this article to April meeting

7th - Voted to allow to all the soldiers who did military duty in 1830 according to Law their Poll tax notwithstanding they were not returned by their officers as doing their duty

8th Voted to accept of the report of the Sudbury Ministerial Fund Corporation and ordered the same to be recorded as follows

An Act of this commonwealth of Massachusetts passed June 14 D. 1817 establishing a Ministerial Fund in the town of Sudbury makes it the duty of the trustees thereof to make a report to said town showing the state of said Fund with their doings thereon at the annual meeting in March or April - Agreeable to said Act said trustees ask leave to report as follows viz.

The funded sum consists of the following promissory Notes of hand interest to be paid annually the 30th of August
