In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify and warn all the male inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at the Meeting-house in Sudbury on Monday the 4th day of April next at 1 o'clock in the afternoon being the first Monday in said month.

To bring in their votes to the Selectmen for a governor Lieutenant Governor for the year ensuing - And for five Senators on one ballot for the district of Middlesex for the year ensuing.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public Meeting-house in said town two sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of holding said meeting. Given under our hands and seals this 21st day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one
