

April 2. 1831

At a legal meeting of the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury
in the County of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts
qualified by the Constitution to vote for Governor, Lieutenant
Governor and Senators held on the fourth day of April, being the first
Monday of said month, in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and thirty one for the purpose of giving in
their votes for Governor and Lieutenant Governor of said
Commonwealth, and for five Senators votes for the following
persons were given in, sorted, counted, and recorded and declaration
thereof made as by the Constitution is directed viz.

For Governor

His Ex. Levi Lincoln fifty three votes
Marcus Morton sixty votes
Lemuel Shaw three votes
Thomas A. Wentworth one vote

Lieut Governor

Thomas A. Wentworth forty five votes
William Willis twenty seven votes
Marcus Morton two votes

Senators

Francis Winsor thirty two votes
Samuel Dana thirty six votes
Charles Paine sixty two votes
Paul Willard thirty six votes
Daniel Richardson twenty two votes
John Lusk twenty seven votes
Abraham Stearns twenty eight votes
Nathanael Brooks thirty two votes
Nathaniel Peaves one vote
Eliphaz Case seventeen votes
Elias Phinney seven votes
William Austin one vote
Benjamin Wyman one vote
Jacob Prives one vote
John Wade thirty six votes
