

CS Middlesex p. April 2. 1831

To Levi Smith Constable of the town of Sudbury
in the county of Middlesex

Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed
to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote
in elections and in town affairs to meet at the meeting-house in
said Sudbury on Monday the fourth day of April next
at one o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following
Articles

1st to choose a Moderator

2nd to fill all vacancies in the town officers which appear to exist
which the law requires to be filled in the month of March or April

3rd to bring in their votes for a County Treasurer

4th to bring in their votes for a Register of Deeds

5th to see if the town will accept of the Settlement of the Selectmen
with the town Treasurer and order the same to be recorded

6th to hear reports of Committees should any be made and
act thereon

7th to act on the 5th 6th and 12th Articles in the Warrant for
March-meeting which were put over to April meeting

8th to see if the town will make an addition of one or more to their
apportion the present year - by request of Benj. W. Richardson

9th to see if the town will exempt Noah Smith from highway
taxes

10th to see if the town will purchase a blank book for
Records of Valuation and Taxes

11th to see if the town will order the Treasurer to pay the amount of
their Poll tax to all those soldiers in town who shall produce
a Certificate from the commanding officers that they have actually
performed all military duty according to law the past year
to do or act any way on this article as the town shall think
best when met

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested Copy
thereof at the public meeting-house in said town two Sabbaths at least
before the time of holding said meeting

Hereof full note and make due return of this Warrant with your
doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of holding said meeting
Given under our hands and seals this 21st day of March in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one
