12.8. Middlesex Co. To Thomas Stearns Constable of the town of Sudbury
in the County of Middlesex Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby ordered
to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury
qualified to vote for Representatives to meet at the Meetinghouse
in Sudbury on Wednesday the eleventh day of May next at 10 o'clock
in the afternoon

1st to bring in their votes to the Selectmen for a Representative
to represent them in the General Court to be held at Boston
on the last Wednesday of May next.

2nd to bring in by Ballot Yes or No to a proposed amendment
of the Constitution of this Commonwealth agreeable to a Resolution
of the Legislature of this Commonwealth passed March 7th 1831

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested
copy thereof at the Meetinghouse in Sudbury two Sabbaths at least
before the time of holding said meeting

Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your
doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of holding
said meeting

in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty
one
