10th Article brought forward — Voted to accept of the Report of the Poor-house Committee as follows

By our committee chosen at the last March-meeting to make some inquiries relative to purchasing a farm for the accommodation of the Poor of the town and to report at some future meeting have attended to that service and ask leave to report as follows (viz.)

That after viewing several farms that were offered have selected two as being in their opinion the most suitable for said purpose

first Mr. Joel Parmenter's farm with Mr. Noah Smith's Pasture adjoining both containing about 100 acres price twenty eight hundred Dollars

2^d Capt. Abel B. Jones & Mr. Levi Dow's farms together containing about 130 acres price \$4000, 00

11th Voted that the Levi Maynard case remain in the hands of the present Agents to act as they shall think best.

12th Voted to appropriate \$250. received from the County Treasurer and \$11.45 from money received from David Pulls vote to pay the expense of the Orange Case

13th Passed over this article

14th Voted to grant seventy five Dollars for the support of a singing school and chose a committee of five to lay out the money at their discretion viz.
