To Thomas Stearns Constable of the town
of Sudbury in the county of Middlesex Greeting,

In the name of the commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are hereby ordered to notify and warn the in-
habitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote
in town affairs to meet at the public meeting-house
in said Sudbury on Monday the 22nd day of August
current at 1 o'clock in the afternoon then and there
to act on the following articles -

- 1st To choose a Moderator.
- 2nd To take such measures as the town shall think
proper to make the road located on the petition
of Samuel Townsend and others - and grant a suitable
sum of money for the same.
- 3rd To take such measures as the town shall think
proper to make the road laid out by the selectmen
and accepted by the town for the use of Josiah Hays &c.
and grant a suitable sum of money for the same.
- 4th To see if the town will choose an agent or agents to
oppose the straightenings and pieces of new highway as
prayed for in the petition of Levi Warren & others.
- 5th To see if the town will assist Mr. Jesse Willis in
paying the expense of his son's sickness in East Sudbury.
- 6th To see if the town will take any measures for the purpose of
purchasing a poor Establishment and appoint a committee
for that purpose and clothe them with power to carry the
same into effect or do or act any way on this article as
the town shall think best when met by request of
John Hunt and others.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting
up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting ^{house} in said town
two sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.
