In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections, to meet at the public Meetinghouse in said Sudbury on Monday the 14th day of November next at 12 o'clock Meridian, being the second Monday of said month.

To bring in their votes to the Selectmen for a Governor and Lieutenant-Governor of the Commonwealth, and for five Senators,

on one ballot, for the district of Middlesex for the year ensuing.

And to choose a Representative to represent them in the General Court to be holden at Boston on the first Wednesday of January next.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public Meetinghouse in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doing thereon, to ourselves, at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.

Given under our hands and seals this 30th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one.
