

November 14th 1831

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury in the county of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, qualified by the Constitution to vote in elections held on Monday the 14th day of November being the second Monday of said month in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one for the purpose of giving in their votes for Governor and Lieutenant ^{Governor} of the Commonwealth and for five Senators for the district of Middlesex, and to choose a Representative to represent them in the General Court to be holden at Boston on the first Wednesday of January next.

Votes for the following persons were given in sorted counted and recorded and declaration thereof made as by the Constitution is directed.

Samuel Osborn Esq. one vote

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Then chose John Hunt to represent them in the General Court to be holden at Boston on the first Wednesday of January next.
