in the County of Middlesex Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are hereby ordered to notify and warn the in-
habitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in
town affairs to meet at the public Meeting house in said
Sudbury on Monday the 14th day of November next at
2 o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the
following articles

1. To choose a Moderator.
2. To see if the town will give leave to certain individuals
to put a stove in the Meetinghouse provided they obtain
one by subscription.
3. To see if the town will excuse Thomas Stearns from
serving as Constable the remainder of the year and
choose another in his place.
4. To see if the town will discount certain taxes to Levi
Smith and G. G. Cutler.
5. To see if the town will authorize the agents to borrow
money to settle with the town of East Sudbury for
the support of Levi Maynard and family and costs
of Court to do or act any way on this article as the
town shall think best.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy
thereof at the public Meetinghouse in said town two Sabbaths at least
before the time for holding said meeting

Thereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your
doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
