In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are
hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of
the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs,
to meet at the public Meeting house in said Sudbury
on Monday, the 30th day of January current, at one o'clock
in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following
articles. —

1. To choose a Moderator.

2. To see what measures the town will take to support their poor
the coming season — whether to let them out to one or
more contractors for one or more years — or see if the town
shall think best to buy a Poor Establishment to support
them on, or take any others measures as respects the disposal
of said poor as the town shall think best by request of
Enoch Thidder and others.

3. To see what measures the town will take to repair their
highways the coming season to do or act any way on this
article as the town shall think proper —

4. To see if the town will grant a suitable sum of money
to repair their highways the coming season —

And you are directed to serve this warrant, by posting up an
attested copy thereof at the public Meeting house in said town two
Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting —

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant, with your
doings thereon, to ourselves, at the time and place of meeting as
aforesaid —
