

April 2, 1832

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the 2nd day of April A.D. 1832 the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner (viz.)

1. Chose William Brigham Moderator
2. Chose William Brigham town treasurer; then voted to put this article over for the present and take up the 3rd article; then voted to let out the collecting of taxes the present year to Willard Maynard at 1/2 per cent. then voted to take up the 2nd article and chose Willard Maynard Constable then took up the
3. Article and voted to put over to May meeting the consideration of discounting the following taxes to Thomas Stearns viz.
John Sawyer's, Willard Wiley's, John Wallis: —
then voted to discount to Samuel Stule's tax \$1.45 Robert Harrington's \$1.45; Sarah Hayden's \$1.12; William Robbins \$1.45 Jonas Goodnow's \$1.45; Francis W. Green's \$1.45 & Walter Hayes's \$1.45
4. Lucatus Colby's and Henry Towers Taxes were offered to be discounted and the town voted the consideration of them be put over to May meeting
5. Passed in the affirmative viz. that the town grants after this present year be made in the month of April.
6. Voted to appropriate \$55.33 from the surplus of 1831 to pay the assessors the balance due them for making the taxes and taking the valuation in 1831.
7. Voted to accept of the Settlement of the Selectmen with the Treasurer and ordered the same to be recorded; which is as follows
