In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby ordered to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the public meeting-house in said Sudbury on Monday the 7th day of May next at 1 o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles—

1. To choose a Moderator.

2. To grant money for the support of the Summer and Winter Schools and order how the same shall be distributed.

3. To see if the town will accept of the offer of the Rev. Rufus Thurlbut and grant the sum of four hundred Dollars instead of four hundred fifty seven Dollars 95⁰⁰ for his Salary in addition to the interest arising from the ministerial fund—

4. To grant money for the support of the Poor the present year.

5. To grant money to pay the Assessors the present year.

6. To grant money to pay the town Treasurer.

7. To grant money to pay amounts allowed by the Committee on amounts.

8. To grant money to pay the money borrowed by the town to pay the expenses of the East Sudbury law suit—

9. To grant money to pay the Ballam for making the road located on the petition of Samuel Townsend and others.

10. To grant money to make the road located on the petition of Asher Goodnow and others.
