

May 2d. 1832.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday May 5th A.D. 1832. The articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner — — —

1. Chose William Brigham Moderator.

2. Granted for the Summer schools two hundred Dollars — \$200 —

do Winter Schools three hundred seventy five ^(Dollars) 375 —

do for Wood ^{and mowing fires} for W. Schools forty five Dollars — 45.

Then voted that the money be divided equally among the five school districts —

3. Put over for the present. —

4. Granted the sum of six hundred and ten Dollars for the support of the poor — — — \$610 —

Then granted an addition of one hundred Dollars. 100 —

5. Granted to pay the assessors twenty Dollars — 20 —

6. Granted to pay the town treasurer ten Dollars — 10 —

7. Put over for the present. — —

8. Granted to pay the money borrowed by the town to defray the expense of the East Sudbury Law Suit seven hundred fifteen Dollars 20/00 — — — \$715.20

9. Put over for the present.

10. Put over for the present.

11. Granted the sum of seventy eight Dollars 20/00 to pay their Poll tax to those soldiers who shall do military duty according to Law the present year — — \$78.20

12. Voted that the Selectmen provide some suitable person to take care of the Meeting house, ring the Bell & dig graves, as occasion may require — —
