To Willard Maynard Constable of the town of
Sudbury in the County of Middlesex Greeting.
In the name of the commonwealth of Massachusetts you are
hereby required to notify & warn the inhabitants of the town
Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at the Meeting
house in said Sudbury on Monday the 12th day of ~~Nov~~
November current at 12 o'clock Meridian being the second
Monday of said month 1st to bring in their votes
to the Selectmen for a Governor and Lieutenant Gov-
ernor of the commonwealth, and for five Senators on
one ballot for the district of Middlesex for the year ensuing.
2. To choose a Representative to represent them in the Gen-
eral Court to be holden at Boston on the first Wednesday of
January next.

3. To bring in their votes to the Selectmen for fourteen
Electors of President and Vice President of the United
States, qualified according to the Constitution of the
United States, agreeable to an act of the General Court
passed March 24th 1832

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up
an attested copy thereof at the public Meeting house in
said Sudbury two Sabbath's at least before the time of
holding said meeting. Hereof fail not and make
due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to
ourselves at the time & place of meeting as aforesaid.
