

November 9, 1832

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified by the Constitution to vote in elections, held on Monday the 12th day of Nov. 9, 1832 for the purpose of giving in to the Selectmen their votes for Governor & Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth and for five Senators for the district of Middlesex - and also to choose a Representative to represent them in the General Court of this Commonwealth - and to give in their votes for fourteen Electors of President & Vice President of the United States votes for the following persons were given in sorted, counted, declaration thereof made and recorded according to law viz.
