To Willard Maynard Constable of the town of

Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts  
you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the  
town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town & parish affairs to  
meet at the Meeting house in said Sudbury on Monday the  
12th day of November current at 2 o'clock in the afternoon  
then and there to act on the following articles viz.

1. To choose a Moderator.

2. To see what measures the town will take to furnish their Poor  
Establishment & hire an Overseer to do or act any way on  
this article as the town shall think best.

3. To see if the town will sell any Wood standing on their  
Poor Farm & authorise some person or persons to sell it.

4. To see if the town will authorise some person or  
persons to get their Poor Farm surveyed and obtain  
a plan of the same.

5. To see if the town will discount certain Taxes to Willard Maynard

6. To see if the town will refund to Mr. John Wallis his Poll  
Tax for the year 1831. ~~to do or act any way on this article.~~

7. To see if the town will accept of a road as laid out by the  
Selectmen on the petition of Stephen W. Balcom and  
others.

8. To see what measures the town will take to furnish  
wood for the Stoves in the Meeting house & hire some  
person to make fires and tend them.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by  
posting up an attested copy thereof at the Meeting  
house in said Sudbury two Sabbaths at least  
before the time of holding said meeting.
