

November 1832

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the 12th day of November in the year of our Lord 1832 the preceding warrant was taken up and acted upon in the following manner viz. /

1. Chose William Brigham Moderator.

Then voted to adjourn this meeting for one fortnight at 1 o'clock in the afternoon at this place. ---

November 26th 1832 The town met according to adjournment and proceeded to the unfinished business of the preceding warrant by voting first to pass over for the present the 2, 3, & 4th articles of the warrant & to take up the 5th article and under that voted to discount to Willard Maynard the Collector the following Taxes viz.

Chauncy Moor's \$ 2.16
Abigail Dutton's - 1.13
James P. Wheeler's - 1.88
Samuel Sawyers - 1.88
and
The Administrator
of
Nathan Parmenter's Estate 3.67

6th article was taken up & the town voted to pass over this article

7th Voted to accept of the road as laid out by the Selectmen agreeable to their Report and ordered the Report to be recorded. (which Report is recorded in the town's Book of Records for Roads & perambulations of town lines &c 2 page 1st)

8. Voted that the Selectmen be directed to agree with some person to furnish wood for the Stoves in the meetinghouse & make fires & tend them. - Then voted that unappropriated money now in the treasury belonging to the Parish be appropriated to defray said expense
