Middlesex Co. To Willard Maynard constable of the town of
Sudbury in the county of Middlesex — Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are
hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the
town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to
meet at the public Meetinghouse in said Sudbury
on Monday the 26th day of November current at 2 o'clock
in the afternoon then and there to act on the following
articles viz.

1. To choose a Moderator

2. To see if the town will take any measures to approve the
straightenings on the north road as proposed for in
the petition of James Laws & others.

3. To see if the town will take any measures to dispose
of the John Green farm to do or act any way on this
article as the town shall think best.

4. To hear the Reports of committees and act thereon —

5. To see if the town will take any measures to repair
their Hearse & Hearse-house to do or act any way on
this article

6. To see if the town will take any measures to repair the
bridge to do or act any way on this article.

7. To see if the town will take any measures to
make a settlement with John Wallis concerning
his Poll Tax for 1831. —

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting
up an attested copy thereof at the public meeting house
in said Sudbury two Sabbaths at least before the
time for holding said meeting. —
