

November 1832.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the 26th day of November D. 1832. the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner viz.

1. Chose William Brigham Moderator.
2. Voted to oppose the straightenings on the north road as prayed for in the petition of James Laws & others then voted to choose two agents for said purpose - then chose Luther Goodnow & Asher Goodnow -
3. Voted that Asher Goodnow, John Hunt & Christopher G. Cutler be a committee & be directed to sell all the right the town has to the John Green farm.
4. Voted to accept of the Report of the committee chosen at a previous meeting to examine the situation of our several school districts, which Report is as follows viz. Your Committee chosen at last May meeting to examine into the situation of our several school Districts and report at some future meeting have attended to that service and now leave to report as follows to wit -

It is the opinion of your committee that some of our School Districts are too large in particular the Centre District, but your committee have not been able to devise any measure whereby the evil can be removed at present.
