To Willard Maynard Constable of the Town
of Sudbury in the County of Middlesex --- Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you
are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of
Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet
at the public Meeting house in said Sudbury on
Monday the 4th day of February next at 1 o'clock
in the afternoon then and there to act on the
following articles, viz.

1. To Chose a Moderator.

2. To see what measures the town will take relative
to the Petition of William Parker & Samuel
Townsend who have petitioned the Legislature of
this Commonwealth that the Real Estate of said
Parker & Townsend in the town of Sudbury maybe
annexed to the town of Stow - to take any me-
asures the town shall think proper on the
subject -

3. To hear all Reports of Committees should any
be offered & act thereon ---

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up
an attested copy thereof at the public meeting house in said
Sudbury two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding
said meeting ---

Thereof fail not and make due return of this Warrant with your
doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of
meeting as aforesaid ---
