128 Middlesex ss. To Willard Maynard Constable of the town
128 of Sudbury in the county of Middlesex — — Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby ordered to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections & in town affairs to meet at the public Meeting-house in said Sudbury on Monday the 4th day of March next, at 12 o'clock Meridian, then and there to act on the following articles:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To bring in their votes for County Treasurer.
3. To see if the town will restrain horses, neat cattle, sheep & swine, from running at large within the limits of the town, the year ensuing.
4. To determine the manner of repairing the highways, town-ways, & bridges, the year ensuing, and to grant money for the same.
5. To see what measures the town will take to collect the Taxes that may be assessed upon the inhabitants of the town the present year and agree with some suitable person to collect the same.
6. To see if the town will choose a committee to examine & adjust all accounts that may be brought against the town and allow the same if reasonable.
7. To hear the report of the trustees of the Sudbury Ministerial Fund Corporation. —
8. To see if the town will authorise some person to give a deed of the John Green farm when sold. —
