9. To see if the town will appropriate from any money now in the treasury, money sufficient to pay certain Poll Taxes to soldiers who did military duty in 1831 and have not received their Poll Tax. --

10. To see if the town will ^{take any measures to} new district the town, to build one or more new schoolhouses or take any measures on the subject the town shall think proper.

11. To see if the town will build a townhouse in connection with the Center schoolhouse -- to take any measures on the subject the town shall think proper.

12. To see if the town will appropriate from the surplus of 1832 money sufficient to pay the Assessors a balance due them for making Taxes in 1832.

13. To hear all reports of Committees & act thereon.

And you are directed to serve this warrant, by posting up an attested Copy thereof, at the public meeting-house in said Sudbury, two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon, to ourselves, at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
