

April 2. 1833

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury
in the County of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts
qualified by the Constitution to vote for Representatives
in the General Court holden on the first day of April
being the first Monday of said month in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty
three for the purpose of giving in their votes for a
Representative of said Commonwealth in the Congress
of the United States, for District Number four.

The whole number of votes given in were sorted,
counted, recorded and declaration thereof made, as by
law is directed - and were for the following persons,

For Hon. Edward Everett of Charleston sixty five votes

Hon. John Wade of Woburn ten votes

Then voted that this meeting be dissolved.
