In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify & warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at the public meeting house in said Sudbury on Monday the eleventh day of November next at twelve o'clock Noon, being the second Monday of said month — To bring in their votes to the Selectmen for a Governor & Lieutenant-Governor of the Commonwealth & for five Senators, on one ballot for the district of Middlesex for the year ensuing. And —

To choose a Representative to represent them in the General Court to be held at Boston on the first Wednesday of Jan. next. And — To bring in by ballot for or against the proposed Amendment of the Constitution of this Commonwealth submitted to the people by a Resolve of the General Court passed March 18th A.D. 1833.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof, at the public meeting house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting —

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid —

Given under our hands and seals this thirty first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three —
