At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections held on Monday the eleventh day of November A. D. 1833 agreeable to the preceding warrant the following votes were given in, sorted, counted, and declaration thereof made according to law viz. —

John Quincy Adams seventy votes

John Davis thirty two votes

Marius Norton fifteen votes

For Lieut. Governor

Samuel Lathrop seventy one votes

Samuel B. Armstrong thirty votes

James Fowler fifteen votes
