Middlesex Co. Town of Sudbury Dec. 11th 1833

Pursuant to the within warrant I have notified the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury herein described to meet at said time and place and for the purposes within mentioned by posting up an attested copy of this warrant at the public Meeting-house in said town two Sabbaths before the time set for said meeting.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the 11th day of December in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and thirty three the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon in the following manner.

1. Chose William Brigham Moderator.
2. Voted to take the maps of Mr. Wood at sixty eight Dollars. (the town receiving from Mr. Wood all the money received by him from the sale of such as he has sold).

Then voted that each individual in town shall have a Map of the town for twenty eight Cents; and all those inhabitants who have purchased a Map of Mr. Wood shall receive twelve Cents from the money refunded by him. - Then voted that the town Clerk receive said Maps & sell them out.

3. Voted to disburse to Willard Maynard Collector the following Taxes on son of Thomas Bent \$1.25:
Nathan Carter \$0.49: Otis Hammond \$0.96:
Charles Macintire \$1.75. -

4. Voted to choose a committee to examine Pantry Bridges and report at some future meeting. Then chose Capt. Israel Haynes, Aaron Hunt & Capt. Wm. Brigham.
