In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby directed to notify & warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Meeting house in said Sudbury on Monday the first day of Sept. next at three o'clock in the afternoon then and there to act on the following articles —

1. To choose a Moderator.

2. To see what measures the town will take relative to an action commenced against the town by Wm. Munk 3^d for damages in overturning his Chaise on the highway in said town in June last. to do or act any way on this article as the town shall think best. —

3. To see if the town will choose a Committee to meet a committee from East Sudbury on the subject of straightening the line between the two towns to do or act any way on this article as the town shall think best.

4. To see if the town will advise the Overseers of the Poor to commence an action against the town of Westminster for the support of Luke Parker or Luke Hammond & family —

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the public Meeting house in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
