To Willard Maynard Constable of the town of
Sudbury in the County of Middlesex — Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are
required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of
Sudbury qualified to vote in elections to meet at the
public meeting-house in said Sudbury on Monday the
tenth day of November next being the second Monday
of said month at twelve o'clock Meridian —

To bring in ~~their~~ votes to the Selectmen for a Governor
and Lieutenant-Governor of this Commonwealth and
for five Senators on one Ballot for the District of
Middlesex for the year ensuing —

And to choose a Representative to represent them
in the General Court to be holden at Boston on the
first Wednesday of January next.

And to bring in their votes for a representative for
District Number four to the next Congress of the
United States —

And you are directed to serve this warrant by
posting up an attested copy thereof at the public
meeting-house in said town two Sabbaths at least
before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this
warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves
at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
