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Middlebury

To Willard Maynard Constable of the town
of Sudbury in the County of Middlebury - Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are
directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury
qualified to vote in town affairs also all those qualified
to vote in Parish affairs to meet at the public meeting-house
in said Sudbury on Monday the tenth day of November
next at two o'clock in the afternoon then and there
to act on the following articles:

1. To choose a Moderator.
2. To see if the town will appropriate any unapropriated
money now in the treasury to pay Thomas Stearns for
John Sawyers Tax for the year 1831 which he paid into
the treasury and which cannot be collected.
3. To hear and act on all Reports of Committees that may
be offered.
4. To see if the town will discount to Willard Maynard
certain Taxes that he may offer to be discounted -
also certain Taxes to Thomas Stearns that he may
offer.
5. To see if the town will choose a Committee to furnish
Wood for the Stoves in the Meeting-house the present
season - and agree with some person to make
fires in the Stoves.
6. To see if the town will give liberty to use the
several school-houses for religious meetings -
to do or act any way on the article as the town
may think best.
